

Day 11 Get Set, Continued

We're going to split this assignment up over a couple of days, in case you've got 12 children rather than my 6 or someone else's 2! Don't want to overwhelm anyone! I am going to do 3 of my kids each day (including the extra stuff I'll do with my toddler/preschooler).

Grab your list of goals for each child, as well as your curriculum lists from yesterday. First, write in what subjects you need to cover. Each year can be different; some are involved with umbrella schools which have their own requirements, while others may have a co-op situation where someone else has chosen curriculum for certain subjects already, and then again some want to design their curriculum plan (or "no-curriculum" plan!) all by themselves. My school, for example, requires that we cover Bible, History, Math, English and Science each year, at whatever level our kids are at. This is a pretty basic list, and if done yearly would probably cover any state requirements you might need to keep in mind, but go ahead and check if you haven't already and make sure you're planning to do all that's required, in whatever way you chose to do it.

Now, fill it in! Easy, right? ;-) Don't forget to put in your extras; for example, I want to cover foreign languages, art, music and some sort of physical education. My eldest is taking guitar lessons and the oldest girl will be in ballet, while everyone will do Latin at their own levels as well as taking a look at our "artist of the month" (I've been planning to do this for what, 10 years now?) So I still need to figure out the other children's plans in a few areas. Feel free to change/omit anything I've suggested on this list for your own kids--you're the boss!
